# GOD IS OUR CREATOR

## When We Create, We Channel His Creative Powers

**BEN:** Dear Father, did you see the drawing that I made? I love doing art and creating drawings of angels, but other children don't know how to do that, although they can create other things that I can't. Why is that?

**GOD:** Dear Little Ben, in Romans 12:6–8, Paul speaks about spiritual and creative gifts. He tells us, “We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness”. The unique creative skills that you and the other children have originate from Me, who have created the world and humanity. Your creative talents are endowments that I bestow upon individuals – they are My gifts to you.

**BEN:** But what's the reason why you give the gift of creativity in different forms to different people?

**GOD:** These gifts are spiritual talents and creative functions meant to build up the body of Christ - the Church. As Paul reiterates in 1 Corinthians 12:4-7; 27, “Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. [...] Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.”

In Romans 12:4-5, he explains it further, “For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another.”

In other words, this creative diversity is a strength, as each individual's unique creative talents contribute to the overall well-being and functioning of the body of Christ.

**BEN:** And what are the functions of the body of Christ, the purpose of the Church?

**GOD:** One of them is Stewardship: individuals are called to be good stewards of their creative talents, using them responsibly and diligently.

The Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-30) illustrates this point, where servants are held accountable for how they utilise the resources entrusted to them. It also teaches us that growth occurs through use – the creative talents I gave you are meant to be developed and exercised, not hidden or neglected. The Parable of the Talents also suggests that neglecting the gift of creativity that I gave you can lead to negative consequences; while actively using it brings about My blessings and rewards.

This parable uses ‘talents’ (a large sum of money) symbolically to teach about using My gifts, the talents and the creativity I give humanity responsibly. I expect individuals to develop and multiply what I have entrusted to them - whether spiritual gifts, resources, or creative talents.

**BEN:** Has the Body of Christ got any other functions to be fulfilled through the creative skills You give us?

**GOD:** Yes, Ben. Another important function of the Church is Service to Others. In 1 Peter 4:10, it is declared, “Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received.” In other words, a primary purpose of these creative skills is to help others and build up the community, by using the creativity and talents I give you to contribute to the well-being of all. Peter encourages believers to use their gifts to serve one another, recognising that these are spiritual endowments and manifestations of My grace.

**BEN:** Thank you, Father. Anything else we need to use our creative skills for?

**GOD:** Ultimately, the purpose of My creative gifts is to glorify Jesus Christ, not yourselves. By using your talents to serve others and contribute to My purpose, you can offer back to Me the blessings and creativity I have given you. My gifts of creativity to you are an opportunity to serve Jesus, participate in His work in the world and offer glorification to Him.

Peter proclaims (1 Peter 4:11), “Whoever speaks must do so as one speaking the very words of God; whoever serves must do so with the strength that God supplies, so that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ. To him belong the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen.”

**BEN:** Amen.

### ASPARAGUS & MEATBALL ORZO

(Courtesy Good Food Magazine) This is a fuss free feast. Serves 4

#### **Ingredients :**

pack of 12 meatballs or you could make your own.

500g pack orzo pasta.

Large bunch of asparagus sliced lengthways.

200g tub creme fraiche.

#### **Method :**

heat oven 180c/160c fan/ gas 4.

Put the meatballs on a tray lined with foil, season and cook for 20 minutes until cooked through.

Meanwhile, bring a pan of salted water to the boil,

add the orzo and cook for 4 minutes then add the asparagus and simmer for 4 minutes more.

Drain, then tip back into the pan along with the meatballs and creme fraiche, mix and season well.

## PLUM CAKE.

(Courtesy Good Food Magazine) makes 16 squares.

This is an upside down cake.

### **Ingredients :**

butter for greasing.

2tbsp demerara sugar.

500g plums. 175g butter.

175g dark muscovado sugar.

140g golden syrup.

2 eggs beaten. 200ml milk.

300g self raising flour.

1/2tsp Bicarbonate of Soda.

1tbsp ground ginger.

1 tsp mixed spice.

### **Method :**

heat oven 180c/160 fan/gas 4.

Grease and line the base of a 23cm square cake tin with baking parchment.

Butter the paper generously and sprinkle with the demerara sugar.

Halve the plums and arrange in the base of the tin in 1 layer, cut sides down.

Melt the butter, muscovado sugar and syrup in a large pan over a low heat, stirring until smooth.

Cool for 10 minutes, then stir in the eggs and milk.

Sift in the flour Bicarbonate of Soda and spices.

Mix until smooth. Pour the batter into the tin, over the plums, and bake for 45 - 55 minutes until firm to the touch.

Cool in the tin for 10 minutes, then turn out onto a wire rack and leave to cool.

Will keep in the fridge, wrapped in baking parchment and foil, for up to 5 days.

This simple bake is lovely with a cuppa. Or have it for dessert instead, with custard or ice cream. Freezable -Nut-free -Vegetarian

## Ingredients

500g white or wholemeal bread

500g mixed dried fruit

85g mixed peel

1½ tbsp mixed spice

600ml milk

2 large eggs

beaten

140g light muscovado sugar

zest 1 lemon

(optional)

100g butter

melted

2 tbsp demerara sugar

## Method:

Step 1 Tear 500g white or wholemeal bread into a large mixing bowl and add 500g mixed dried fruit, 85g mixed peel and 1½ tbsp mixed spice.

Step 2 Pour in 600ml milk, then stir or scrunch through your fingers to mix everything well and completely break up the bread.

Step 3 Add 2 beaten large eggs, 140g light muscovado sugar and zest of 1 lemon, if using. Stir well, then set aside for 15 mins to soak.

Step 4 Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Butter and line the base of a 20cm non-stick square cake tin (not one with a loose base).

Step 5 Stir the melted butter into the pudding mixture, tip into the tin, then scatter with demerara.

Step 6 Bake for 1½ hrs until firm and golden, covering with foil if it starts to brown too much. Turn out of the tin and strip off the paper. Cut into squares and serve warm.

### Ingredients:

2 large lemons  
500gm vanilla quark,  
200g lighter soft cheese,  
225g gingernut biscuits  
90g butter,

3 medium eggs,  
50g plain flour,  
150g icing sugar,  
20cm springform tin

### Method:

Pre-heat oven to 180C / 350F/ Gas mark 4  
Grate & juice the lemons.  
In a bowl put lemon rind, juice & icing sugar & beat well.  
Beat the eggs & add to the mixture. in another bowl  
beat together the quark, flour & soft cheese.  
Make crumbs of the gingernuts, melt the butter & stir crumbs &  
butter together/  
Line the tin with non-stick paper & press the crumb mixture into  
the base.  
Pour the lemon mixture into the tin & bake in the oven for 46-50  
minutes until set

## YOUR MONTHLY GARDENING CHECKLISTS: **FLOWERS**

May is an interesting month in the garden, as the last of the spring bulbs are on show, and the first of the summer-flowering perennials are starting to bloom. There's plenty to cut for indoor spring displays, including **alliums**, peonies and **tulips**.

By growing more May-flowering plants you will not only have a more colourful garden but also a greater range of flowers to pick for the vase, making your spring floral displays even more vibrant.

When cutting flowers for indoor cut flower arrangements, make sure you cut the flowers early in the morning, when their stems are turgid (full of water). This will ensure they last longer. Plunge them into a bucket of water straight away.

### **Flowers:**

**Prune** spring shrubs, such as **forsythia** and **Chaenomeles**, after flowering to keep them compact

Plant out **dahlia tubers** and **cannas** after all risk of frost has passed

Tie in the new shoots of climbing plants,

including **clematis**, **wisteria** and **honeysuckle**, to their **supports**

Continue sowing **annuals**, such as **California poppies**, into gaps in borders for colour from August into autumn

Plant up **hanging baskets**, but keep in a greenhouse or porch for a few weeks to establish, before putting outside

Apply liquid **feed** to **tulips**, **daffodils** and other spring bulbs to encourage a good display next year

Plant out **summer bedding** and tender annuals,

including **sunflowers**, **cosmos** and **nasturtiums**, after the last frost

Remove faded spring bedding, such as **wallflowers** and **forget-me-nots**, and add to your compost bin

Check **lilies** and **fritillaries** for scarlet **lily beetles** and their larvae, as they can rapidly strip plants of all foliage

Harden off tender plants raised indoors, but bring them back in at night to protect from late frosts

Pinch out the shoot tips of bedding plants and young annuals, such as **fuchsias**, to encourage bushier growth
